1. Courses Offered in Second Half of 2004

The ANU and UNU will be offering the following courses in Japan in the second half of 2004 (timings and detailed course descriptions are provided at the end of this document).

- Terrorism and Counter-Terrorism (Clive Williams)
- Strategic Concepts (Robert Ayson)

2. Enrolment Options

There are two options for enrolment in the above courses. They may be undertaken as:

- part of a full GSSD qualification awarded by the ANU: the Master of Arts (Strategic Studies), Master of Strategic Affairs or Graduate Diploma in Strategic Affairs (each course above counts as 6 units towards one of these qualifications); entry standards are 2A Honours or equivalent for the Masters degrees and a very good 3 year degree for the Graduate Diploma;
- stand-alone courses enrolled as an ANU graduate student (non-Award option); full ANU student privileges and official transcript provided, entry standards are similar to the above;

International Student Fees per course are A\$2,700 per 6 unit course plus approximately \$40 for reading materials.

3. Course Descriptions

Terrorism and Counter-Terrorism (Clive Williams) **October 4 - 8, 2004**

This course is designed to describe the evolution of terrorism and politically-motivated violence, to consider the results of the research that has been undertaken on the motivations of terrorists and terrorist groups, to assess trends in terrorist means and modes, and to evaluate approaches to formulating effective counter-terrorist strategies.

Strategic Concepts (Robert Ayson) **September 27 - October 1, 2004**

This course is designed to achieve two main learning outcomes. First it will provide students with an in depth understanding of leading concepts and ideas in the field of strategic studies (from deterrence and coercion to broad concepts of security). Second it will use specially chosen case studies to illuminate the relevance and application of these ideas in the Asia-Pacific region.
